He is no longer in his earthly embodiment, but he continues to be an eternal source of inspiration to all of us. He was a follower of Great Swami Vivekananda. He left this mortal world with two unfulfilled dreams which we are trying to fulfil by the grace of Sri Sri Thakur-Ma and Swamiji-one is setting up a University at Agarpara Campus of this Mission and second is to build up a good relation with great Ramakrishna Mission and Math. Member will be happy to know that the Mission has been progressing steadily to fulfil both the dreams of Swami Nityananda by the grace of Holy Trinity.



Before I proceed any further, I have to share with you, the news of the demise of our valuable members Sri Dilip Bagchi, Sri Narayan Ghosh, Sri Dipak Sharma and Sri Dibyendu Raha who are much devoted member of the Society who have left this earthly world in the recent past. Today we are praying for peace into the Departed Souls at the Holy feet of Sri Sri Thakur - Ma - Swamiji. RKVM & V.Math through its various branch centres are trying to put into practice the message of Humanity and Harmony in all spheres of our life. Our valuable project for proposed Ramakrishna Paramahansa University will be an effective tool for engineering the message of harmony more widely in the field of Education. In the present scenario of intolerance among the people in the various fields of our society, is a big threat for steady progress of our Country and our global relation with other countries. "Many years before Swami Vivekananda realized this possible threat upon our people and advised us to follow the path of Harmony in all aspects of our life & work following the teachings of Bhagwan Sri Ramakrishna and Ma Sarada Devi which our proposed Ramakrishna Paramhansa University like to spread.

Now I submit the Annual Report on activities, performance, achievements and accounts of the Mission Society for the financial year 2024-2025 alongwith multiple relevant annexures that will provide various information about the Mission and elucidate points given in the text.

Members may kindly recall that the most fundamental object and goal of our Mission-as also the Math-is to serve mankind as our spiritual task of worshiping Shiva-in-Jiva in the needy, irrespective of caste, creed, colour and religions and wherever such persons are to be found. In trying to achieve the goal, our main thrusts are on educational front by imparting quality education from KG to PG, i.e. effort to spread quality education among young boys and girls, and on welfare front, i.e. effort to promote welfare of children, the old and the differently able girls and women. We are also mindful of the need to impart various types of skills - particularly technical skills - to groups of relatively senior boys and girls to enhance their employability. Moreover we have made substantial contribution in the field of Medical care and Relief work. Various statistical data furnished in different annexes to this report will indicate the extent of our success on these fronts. We are actually aware that there is no limit to progress and we can only try to reach the ever receding goals with a view to set an example in Society so that other people could also come forward to serve the humanity in their locality.



We are trying hard and promise to keep on trying harder and harder in days to come till the world attains peace through unity and spirituality.

1. Report on Relief Work rendered by the Mission:-

The following relief activities made especially for flood victims during heavy flood in West Bengal areas like Khanakul, Arambag, UdayNarayanpur etc. Also distribution of winter garments was made during the financial year.

2. Let me now report our progress in some of the important welfare activities for destitute & Orphan Children.

Statistical information relating to welfare homes, educational institutions, medical units and financial positions will show that 2006 inmates including orphan/destitute children deaf, dumb, blind girls and women in distress were maintained free of charges in various welfare homes. The welfare homes are partly supported by the Social Welfare Department and Mass Education Department of the Government of West Bengal. We express our thanks to State Government for their continuous support.

In non-formal education sector, we have maintained 6 Pavement Schools that imparted education to 180 students between the age group 3 to 14 as a part of development of slum/street and red-light areas. In open shelter project we had 25 girl students. The Mission extended educational support to 199 financially weak students of the schools run by the Mission as concession in school and other fees. A JJ Home for 50 boys is functioning at Barrackpore to take residential care of orphan and neglected boys. Mission is extending help to 10 Leprosy affected families every year by purity food items through Manikpara Sri Ramakrishna Ashram, Jhargram. It is also extending help to - poor students per month of Khurda district in Odisha through an Ashram located in that area :



Our open shelter has been providing support to the Barrackpore Commissionerate as short stay home to girls rescued from vulnerable situation and immoral trafficking.

3. Our activities in education sector

There were in the year in question 20,456 students on the rolls of different educational institutions from KinderGarden to PostGraduation (KG to PG) standard under our Mission and Math. Out of them 10,949 students are studying in our schools at Barrackpore under West Bengal Board of Secondary Education on nominal charges. It is a matter of great satisfaction for us that roll strength of the schools are increasing due good academic syllabus and academic atmosphere of the Mission. Some statistics given below will indicate our achievements in this sector. In our Higher Education units No. of beneficiaries comes at 538.

4. Next, we turn our attention to technical education and Vocational Training. To meet the demand of the technical hands required in both public and private sector, our Mission has given a special thrust to development of Industrial Training Institutes and Vocational Training Centres run by the Mission. We have arranged a tie up with Maruti-Suzuki Pvt. Ltd and Bengal Beverages Pvt. Ltd. (a subsidiary of Coca Cola) for offering job to the pass-out students in auto-mechanic trade.

During the year under review, a total number of 379 apprentices and trainees received “on the job” training as per table given below:

5. Our achievements in General education and sector Technical are also noteworthy which

- a) Sri Abir Saha, a student of Bengali Medium under West Bengal State Board has secured 683 out of 700 in Madhyamik Examination in West Bengal.
- b) Km. Sangita Ghosh secured 486 marks out of 500 in Higher Secondary Examination in the State this year.
- c) Our Industrial Training Institute, at Goghat, Hooghly (Sarada Ma PvtITI) affiliated to National Council of Vocational Training has secured 9th position as Private ITI in the State of West Bengal.

6. Our medical units at four places are running satisfactorily.

In course of the year under review a total of 26,590 patients received medical treatment in OPDs of the allopathic and homoeopathic medical centres, both taken together, at Barrackpore, Suryapur, Burdwan, Mandarmoni (in Purba Medinipur district) and Bongaon. The OPD and diagnostic units are equipped with facilities for X-ray, pathology, and ECG Dentistry, Ophthalmology. It is a matter of great satisfaction that our Charitable Medical Unit has got affiliation from Chief Medical Officer of Health as a Polyclinic and Day Care Centre under Clinical Establishment Act. We are going to add USG with the present facilities.

7. Financial Report:-

Members will be glad to know that the overall financial position of the Mission is satisfactory. The table produced below gives the sum and substance of the financial position of the Mission in 2024-25 while comparing the same with the position in 2023-24. Overall performance is satisfactory.

8. I would now submit highlights of a few important events that took place during FY 2024-2025:-

- A. *During the financial year 2024-2025, the most important event of the Mission has happened by the grace of Sri Sri Thakur, Maa and Swamiji fulfilling of our long cherished desire by passing the Bill of Ramakrishna Paramhansa University by the Assembly of West Bengal on 10-12-2024. It was great honour for some members in Governing Body who were invited to attend the Assembly on that day, namely Swami Nityarupananda, Swami Shibatmananda, Swami Prabuddhananda, Sri Shyamal Kumar Das. The desire of most Rev. Swami Nityanandaji has been fulfilled and the Bill sent for assent of Hon'ble Governor of West Bengal by the speaker of West Bengal Legislative Assembly.*



- B. It is a matter of great satisfaction for the members, monks, students & teachers and well wishers of the Mission. It has travelled a long way from the humble beginning in the year 1976 and now has reached to the prestigious and historical celebration of Golden Jubilee which is being celebrated through various programs. As a part of this celebration, a new five storey building of proposed Ramakrishna Paramhamsha University has been inaugurated by Former Hon'ble President of India Sri Ramnath Kovind Ji in presence of many dignitaries including Hon'ble Retd. Justice Shyamal Kumar Sen at 3, B.T. Road, Agarpara Branch.
- C. Swamij has said "Struggle is life" and "Means follow the end"; that have been proved by our continuous struggle in various forum including Legal, Administrative and Political to give life to our B.Ed College which was virtually dead by the order of NCTE, New Delhi withdrawing its affiliation from February 2020. By continuous struggle and putting Our all strength to means, the said B.Ed College named Swami Vivekananda College of Education for Women has reopened at 3, B.T. Road, Agarpara branch of this Mission and now functioning properly.
- D. As a program of Golden Jubilee Celebration of the Mission some impressive activities are being done by the Mission in form of :-
- a) A massive rally of students who were in the dress of Swami Vivekananda, was arranged on National Youth Day celebration where seven thousand students participated happily along with a huge number of guardians and teachers.
 - b) Swami Vivekananda is the central figure of all-round development of a person in particular and the whole Nation in general. With a view to that, Mission has taken a plan of installing Statues of Swami Vivekananda free of cost at different parts of the Country including different Branches of the Mision; And already such statues has been installed at Noida branch, at Gorakhpur branch, at Agarpara branch, at Barrackpore Cantonment with the permission of Defence Ministry, and in some other places it will be installed soon. Such



as in the districts of Howrah, bankura, Purulia and also in Odisha & Assam. Mission has received such appeal for requesting Donation of Statue of Swami Vivekananda at fre of cost from Odisha and Assam also.

9. **Observance of the 12th annual “Commemoration Day” “Sadhu Bhandara” and “NaraNarayanSeva”** in memory of Swami Nityananda Maharaj. On 18th January, 2025, in our Headquarters at Barrackpore, the aforesaid sacred programme was solemnized with devotion, enthusiasm and inspiration. In our main Temple, right from the morning commenced with Sri Sri ‘Geeta’ and ‘Chandi’ recital, Bhajan, Special Puja, oblation of Fire (Hom Yogya) were performed. Around 11 am, commemoration assembly was called to order. At the outset, the welcome address was given by the Astd. Secretary Swami Vedananda Maharaj followed by Swami Saradatmananda Maharaj, Swami Shivarupananda Maharaj, Swami Punnyalokananda Maharaj, Swami Prabuddhananda Maharaj and concluded by Rev. Secretary of the Mission Swami Nityarupananda Maharaj. About 175 monks from different Ashrams joined this programme including Swami Atmabodhananda of Vedanta Math and Swami Saradatmananda of Kacher Mondir.

10. **Swami Nityananda Memorial Award for Nara-Narayan Seva Ceremony 2025.** Members will recall that this Mission has ,in the recent past ,instituted Swami Nityananda Memorial Award for “Nara Narayan Seva” in the sacred memory of late Swami Nityananda Maharaj who was a tireless and every-follower of the motto “জীবে প্রেম করে যেইজন, সেইজন সেবিছে ঈশ্বর” that late Swami Nityananda Maharaj, not only founded the Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission and Vivekananda Math, within a relatively short span of about 35 years but also established more than 35 centres all over this state and elsewhere too, for imparting education as also to ensure well being of a large number of children, particularly destitute children, girls, and women in distress and differently abled women who had no shelter and nowhere to go to.

This award is meant to inspire people to follow his footstep. It is awarded to institutions as also to individuals having commendable track reords of servicing the poor and the needy irrespective of caste, creed, colour or religion, over at least 5 consecutive years. The cash value of each award is Rs. 50,000/- which is accompanied by a citation.

11. Blood Donation Camp:-

A Blood donation camp was arranged where total 60 staff of the Mission donated blood voluntarily in collaboration with BN Bose Hospital.

12. Rural Development Activities:-

During financial year 2024-25 Mission spent Rs 22,24,798/-for conducting various approved activities under Rural Development Project. The donor avails 100% Tax exemption for extending financial help for conducting Rural Development Projects. These Rural Development Projects are being run in rural centres of this Mission in Panchayet Areas of Purulia,Bankura and North 24 Parganas. Expenses incurred for the purpose of honorarium of staff, stipend to trainees, purchasing training materials and other running expenses. Major Vocational training given by the Mission are Tailoring, Electric, Auto-Mechanic, Dairy, Fishery, Agriculture etc. Sale proceeds of Rural development programme was Rs 7,12,818/-.

13. Arranging jobs for unemployed:-

Now a days unemployment is a burning problem of our Country. As per recent statistics, India is blessed with majority of young generation of our total population. Number of young people in India is higher than other countries. It is good in terms of work force but it is a challenge to engage all of this young work force in suitable jobs. This Mission is trying to provide Private jobs to the unemployed in its various work centres for furthering the objects of the society for benefit of people in general and poor people in particular. At present the Mission is maintaining total 1150 workers/ volunteers and paying about Rs. 6,62,39,978/- towards their salary /allowance /honorarium per year.

Acknowledgement

I place on record our heartfelt gratitude to all monastic members, our friends, devotees, followers of Ramakrishna Vivekananda ideas and Central and State Government, benevolent people and various charitable organizations both inside the country as also abroad. An abridged list of our acknowledgement is appended at the end of Report book, I hasten to add that the list is not by any means exhaustive. The Governing Body of the Mission records its deep gratitude not only to those who have been mentioned in the list but also to countless other well-wishers of the Mission. The Governing Body also puts on records its recognition

Street Children International, USA - sponsoring 180 boys & girls for their residential care & education, including children of Suryapur Centre who are deaf, dumb and blind along with 12 children of pavement dwellers/slum in Kolkata for their education and nutrition besides giving normal sponsorship to destitute children for their education/training.
3. Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission, UK Centre - occasional donation for relief work and sponsorship of 25 destitute/orphan children.

I am seeking the divine blessings of Sri Ramakrishna Dev, Holy Mother Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda for each one of us, I also seek the blessings of Rev. Swami Nityananda Maharaj.

Annex-D

A short biographical picture of Sri Ramakrishna Paramhansa Dev, Sri Ma Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda

Sri Ramakrishna Paramhansa Dev (1836-1886)



Sri Ramakrishna was born of poor parents at village Kamarpukur in the district of Hooghly of West Bengal. His earlier name was Sri Gadadhar Chattopadhyay. Even in his very childhood, Gadadhar gave on many occasions, a clear evidence of divine inspiration and power through his thoughts and actions. While very young, he felt a keen urge to know if the Divine power of God manifests itself through everything on earth, particularly through the idols or images the Hindus generally worship.

At the age of seventeen, he was sent to his eldest brother at Kolkata where the latter conducted a Sanskrit academy. On being advised to join studies in keeping with the tradition of the Bramhins, he replied, "Brother, what shall I do with a mere bread winning education? I would rather acquire that wisdom which will illuminate my heart and in getting which, one is satisfied forever." Thereafter he was engaged as a priest in the Holy temple of Goddess Kali on the bank of the Ganges at Dakshineswar, 8 kilometers off towards the north of Kolkata, a city which was then full of western thoughts and more Europeanized than any other city in India. There he practiced in extreme austerity while performing daily worship in the temple of Kali and ultimately realized that God is the goal of human life and God is the only friend of all beings at all times and under all circumstances. Thereupon he wanted to know the Truth in other religions.

Towards the end of 1866, he got formally initiated into Islam. As a non-Hindu, he began to reside outside the precincts of the temple and started dressing and behaving like a devout Muslim reciting the namaz regularly. In 1874, i.e. after about 8 years, he



practiced Christianity imbibing all the teachings of Christ. Thus he tried all beliefs and traversed all different ways one by one. He realized that all the religions are equally true and there are different ways of getting to the truth of existence and everyone has the right to approach God in his or her own way. He said, "A lake has several ghats. At one, the Hindus take water in pitchers and call it "jal"; at another, the Mussalmans take water in leather bags and call it "pani". At the third, the Christians call it "water". Can we imagine that it is not "jal", but only "pani" or "water"? How ridiculous! The substance is one under different names, and everyone is seeking the same substance; only climate, temperament, and name create differences. Let each man follow his own path. If he sincerely and ardently wishes to know God, peace be unto him! He will surely realize Him.'

He expressed in very simple words, with the aid of stories and parables, the great truths he had realized. He was totally free of any dogma and bigotry and emphasized that there could be no claim to monopoly over spiritual matters. Naturally, great scholars and numerous spiritual aspirants, belonging to different sects, with genuine desire for god – realization, were attracted by his wonderful teachings. He did not claim any originality. But with great humility he could keep his audience spellbound for hours together with lucid talks and unfathomable wisdom. During the British rule, education was arranged in such a manner as to turn out men who would be English in taste and intellectual outlook. The shaken Hindu social culture with its spiritual foundation was at a critical juncture when the life and message of Sri Ramakrishna brought fresh strength into the Hindu Society. In fact, from the quiet abode at Dakshineswar he breathed life into Hinduism and ushered in an era of Hindu renaissance.

The great contribution of Sri Ramakrishna to the modern world is the harmony of religions. He preached equal regard for all faiths – "Sarvadharmasadbhava." He was the embodiment of renunciation and example of the complete conquest of lust and of desire for money. By his life Sri Ramakrishna teaches us that pride and power, wealth and glory, are nothing in comparison with the power of spirit. In fact, he was one of those rare beings, in whom the flame of spiritual life burnt so brightly that all who came near were able to share the illumination. Never before the mankind got such a unique personality with synthesis of Jnana, Yoga, Bhakti and Karma.

Annex-E
Sri Saradamoni Devi (1853-1920)



Three miles from Kamarpukur is the village Joyrambati, in the district of Bankura, where Saradamoni Mukherjee was born. At the age of 23, Sri Ramakrishna married Sarada, 5 years old. On being questioned by Sri Ramakrishna, Sarada, on her first visit to Dakshineswar at the age of 19, replied without any reservation that she was not interested in a worldly life and would help him in his pursuit of God. A few days, thereafter, while massaging her husband's feet, Sarada wanted to know what he thought about her. In reply Ramakrishna said, "The divine Mother who is worshipped in the temple is verily the mother who has given birth to this body and who is now putting up in the music tower, and again it is she who is massaging my feet at the present moment, verily, I look upon you as a representation of the blissful Mother in human flesh."

Such behaviour of a husband towards his wife is not recorded anywhere in the history of mankind where the husband saw the divine mother in his wife and yet acted like a husband by allowing her to massage his feet. Thus the Holy couple lived together in a unique bond of love and devotion in the heights of God consciousness without a trace of worldliness. After her husband's demise, she could not wear the widow's garb, as she distinctly felt his continued presence with her and was the source of strength and inspiration in establishing and running the twin great organizations, Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission at Belur in the district of Howrah (West Bengal). Gradually she became the Mother with great love and compassion for all creatures.

Swami Vivekananda (1863-1902)



Swami Vivekananda was born as Narendra Nath Dutta in a liberal and well-to-do family of Kolkata. As a boy, he used to spend long hours in a meditative pose and later on, had radical & modern thoughts. As a true rationalist he rebelled against the idea of accepting anything of faith. He desired to satisfy himself with reasons and evidences. No preaching or sermons were acceptable to him straightway. He met many religious leaders but none could convince him about the existence of God. He had become restless in search of truth when he came in contact with Sri Ramakrishna. Previously he did not believe that the individual and the supreme are identical but Sri Ramakrishna's teachings and careful handling made him realize the all pervasiveness of the 'Spirit.' Thus at the feet of a simple and almost illiterate Ramakrishna, the most intellectual humbled himself.

Swami Vivekananda became highly famous after his historic speech at the Parliament of Religions at Chicago in America in the year 1893. Through him the western world was enriched with a proper idea about the imperishable wealth of spiritual and cultural treasures of India. It is also truly held that the said Parliament is remembered because of Swami Vivekananda. The reasons of his universal popularity is to be traced to the fact that he tried to raise the dignity of man to the highest level and dedicated himself with great devotion to the service of the suffering humanity. His personality bled at the sight of human suffering. He declared that service to the poor, the illiterate, the ignorant; the afflicted is the highest religion. God is present in every 'jiva' and there is no other God besides that. The dignity of man was raised above everything else and he was emphatic on the point that one can find peace and prosperity by serving the suffering humanity more easily than offering tons of fruits and flowers at the holy altar of God. The example he gave was very simple. In our daily life, he said, we find a father is naturally



happy when his children are well taken care of. How can the Supreme Father be happy when tons of flowers and fruits are offered to Him in the temple but His children outside are starving or suffering from ailments? His mission was both national and international. Like Bhagiratha, he brought down the stream of spirituality from the height of Ramakrishna's life for the benefit of the mankind.

As a great lover of humanity, this patriot Saint of Modern India upheld the glory of India's ancient heritage and stressed upon the need for formulating all national programmes on the basis of spirituality. His "Lectures from Colombo to Almora" was the fountain-head of national inspiration to hundreds of freedom fighters of the country. He lived a short life of thirty nine years of which about a decade was spent in intensive social work including establishment of the great Math in the name of his Master at Belur (Howrah). Yet he left for posterity his four classics – Janna Yoga, Bhakti Yoga, Karma Yoga and Raja Yoga, all of which are outstanding treatises on Hindu philosophy.

It has been said that if Ramakrishna was the thought – Swami Vivekananda was the expression. Both the Master and the disciple revealed the spirit of Hinduism at its best and highest espousing at the same time that philosophy and not mythology and rituals was the very soul of every religion. It is because of mistaken attitude towards religion that different communities could not tolerate each other. The cardinal principle of Ramakrishna Movement is "Atmana mokshartham jagatddhitayachaa (the liberation of the self and the welfare of the world)". Swami Vivekananda showed how renunciation can go hand in hand with intense activity for the sake of others.

Lovers see this world as full of love and haters as full of hatred; fighters see nothing but strife and the peaceful nothing but peace. The perfect man sees nothing but God.

A background note on Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission and Vivekananda Math

More than 175 years have passed since Swami Vivekananda, the great disciple of Sri Sri Ramakrishna left this mortal world. The thoughts and ideas, he has left behind, have attracted the attention and caught the imagination of people all over the world. The universal popularity which he enjoyed during his life is explained by the fact that he was a lover of man above anything else, a lover of the poor and the pariahs of our country. It is through service to those poor people that he wanted us to worship God first and then to go to a temple or a church. This, he thought would solve many of our basic problems like those of food, education, shelter etc. and also give us a great impetus in our religious pursuits. He had the utmost faith in the ability and efficiency of Indian youths and he wanted only one thousand young people to be dedicated and scarified at the Holy altar of our nation, our motherland, India, with a view to building up the nation and re-generating its vitality in all directions, particularly in the spiritual field not only for their own good but for the good of other nations as well. His dream of future India has not come true as yet. Hence the malady in all sphere of our society, spiritual as well as mundane.

The only God that Vivekananda wanted us to worship first is the Human Soul in the Human Body i.e. "WORSHIP SHIVA IN JIVA" before pursuing any other religious rites. But unfortunately, we have failed to follow his instructions. The Stone-God is still being fed abundantly in temples while the living Gods are dying of starvation on the street. Instead of worshipping Gods, Vivekananda meditated upon, we have made Vivekananda a God, additional to the existing ones and worship him well enough in his statues and temples. The poor and the pariahs have remained where they were before; they are still living in darkness and distress, in hunger and thirst, in slums and huts. We have only learnt how to spread about Vivekananda's teachings from the press and platform, through Radio and Televisions, without spending even an ounce of our energy or a penny from our earnings for the people for whom Vivekananda lived and died.

It is in this context that the Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission came into being at the initiative of a band of young Sannyasis and Brahmacharis, devotees dedicated to the welfare of the poorest of the poor people of this country, with a view to realizing the Highest Truth in life through selfless service to the suffering humanity irrespective of caste, creed, religion and place of birth by a magnanimous leadership of great Karma Yogi Rev. Swami Nityananda Maharaj, the founder . The Mission came into existence on the 25th October, 1976, in a dilapidated building on the bank of the holy river Ganga at 7, Riverside Road, Barrackpore, district North 24 Parganas, West Bengal, India. It was registered as a society with effect from 1st November, 1976, under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act, 1961 and its actual work started from 1st January, 1977, with only 20 tribal boys from the districts of Birbhum and Bankura, accommodated in the new Welfare Home. Simultaneously a school was started on the grass with a fencing of hessian cloth, as dedication, and not fund, was the only resource available to the Mission.



Vivekananda Math was established in 1977, at 7, Riverside Road, Barrackpore and registered as a Trust in 1980, with a view to providing a platform for the truth-seeker to lead a life in conformity with the teachings of Sri Sri Ramakrishna. The Math prepares monastic workers in accordance with the guidelines laid down by Swami Vivekananda and arranges initiation (Diksha) of devotees. It is a place for preparing oneself in spiritual discipline while performing Missionary activities, in the centres set up and administered by Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission and Vivekananda Math. In fact, the Math functions on the twin ideals of renunciation and service as emphasized by Swami Vivekananda.

The Trustees of the Math organize festivals on the occasions of birth days of Sri Ramakrishna, Sri Ma Sarada Devi, Swami Vivekananda and other direct disciples of Sri Ramakrishna and Lord Buddha, Janmastami, X-mas, Durga Puja, Laxmi Puja, Kali Puja, Viswakarma Puja and Saraswati Puja etc. Every Ekadashi day Ramnama Kirtan is also arranged. At all temples at different Mission and Math centres daily prayer and worship is a must.

Apart from the temple of Sri Sri Ramakrishna at Barrackpore, the proudest possession of Vivekananda Math is the Naranarayan Mandir at Joyrambati. Just as a "Kumari" is worshipped during the Durga Puja, a boy not exceeding the age of 8 years is worshipped daily at the 'Naranarayan Mandir'. Any devotee is welcome to perform this puja at a cost as desired by him. This sort of non-traditional puja which serves a poor boy and brings joy to him along with some material benefit, is sure to enrich the devotee spiritually. In fact, this is meant to give a practical shape of Swami Vivekananda's idea of God Worship in Man (Shiva in Jiva). Said Swamiji, "If in this world one can bring a little joy and peace even for a day into the heart of a single person that much alone is true: all else is mere moonshine".

Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission is a registered society and Vivekananda Math is a registered Trust. The respective ownership, management and control of the Mission and the Math have been entirely vested with the Governing Body of the former and the Board of Trustees of the latter. The Governing Body of the Mission consists of both monastic and non-monastic members but the Trustees of the Vivekananda Math are all monastic members. Both organizations have their headquarters at Barrackpore and people in general, link the name of the Mission with all activities of the Math as well. Both the Mission and the Math have separate funds with separate accounts. In addition to donations from individuals and non-official organizations, the Mission receives financial assistance from the Government. The accounts of the Mission are annually audited by auditors selected in the Annual General Meeting of the Mission Society. The Math fund, however, depends on donations mainly from disciples and non-official sources.

In this connection it is stated that the Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission and the Vivekananda Math at Barrackpore and their branch centres are legally and constitutionally separate from the great organizations viz. Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission at Belur (Howrah) and Sarada Math and Ramakrishna Sarada Mission at Dakshineswar (North 24 Parganas) and their branches throughout the country and abroad.

iii) The areas proposed to be covered by the programme shall qualify as 'Rural Area' within the meaning of Section 35CCA of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

iv) The fund to be raised shall be utilized for the programmes approved by the 'Prescribed Authority' and this should not be diverted for any other purpose.

v) Proper records shall be maintained of all the assets created for the programme of rural development and the assets shall not be transferred or disposed of or mortgaged or utilized for the purpose other than those for which these were acquired.

vi) The representative of the 'Prescribed Authority' shall have the right to visit the places and carry out inspection where the approved programme are being/would be carried out.

vii) The approval is subject to your fulfilling the other conditions laid down in the Act in this behalf as may be amended from time to time by the parliament.

viii) The approval accorded is only for the purpose of Section 35CCA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and should not be construed to convey the approval of the Chief Commissioner of Income Tax or the Central Govt. for any other purpose.

ix) The institution shall maintain a separate bank account for its rural development programme.

3. I am directed to convey that the Prescribed Authority also authorizes The Secretary, Ramakrishna Vivekananda Mission Barrackpore (PAN: AAAAR2145N), P.O. 


